Dear Oakland Resident:

We would like to thank the City of Oakland and the residents for the opportunity to provide trash, recycling and yard waste service to the City of Oakland, effective January 1, 2009.

All three services will be provided on **Tuesday** of each week. The first pickup day will be January 6. Your **trash** can be placed in resident-owned containers or a 96 gallon toter supplied by Waste Management at a cost of \$3.00 per month, which would be billed directly to your home.

Recycling can be co-mingled in an 18 gallon bin, which will be delivered to you the last week of December. The City has applied for a grant to furnish 65 gallon toters for recycling. When they arrive, Waste Management has agreed to assemble and deliver them. You will be notified when they arrive. Until that time, you may place any extra recycling items that do not fit in the 18 gallon bins into other containers labeled "recycling" or in cardboard boxes or bags next to the recycling bins. A list of accepted recycling materials is attached.

Yard waste can be placed in resident owned containers, paper bags or a 96 gallon toter, which can be supplied by Waste Management at a cost of \$3.00 per month directly billed to the resident.

A **bulky** trash item can be placed at the curb on the last trash pickup day of the month and will be taken away at no charge. There is a limit of one item per household. Additional items or items that need special handling can be scheduled for a cost of \$45.

Appliances(White Goods) can be picked up by appointment only and the cost for this service is \$25 per item. Please call **314-506-4700**.

Please have all trash at the curb **by 8 AM** on your pickup day.

IESI should pick up their recycling bins on the last service day in December.

Christmas trees will be picked up with regular service on January 6 and January 13. Please call our Customer Service Center at **314-506-4700** for missed pickups, rental of toters, appliances and additional bulky pickups. **Waste Management thanks you!**

Accepted Materials List

Commingled Containers:

Aluminum Cans, Trays & Foil (trays & foil must be cleaned)

Aseptic Packaging & Gable Top Containers (milk & juice cartons)

Steel Cans and Tins

PET Soda, Water, & Flavored Beverage Bottles (#1 clear and green plastic resin)

HDPE Milk & Juice Jugs (#2 clear plastic resin)

HDPE Detergent & Fabric Softener Containers (#2 colored plastic resin)

PVC Narrow Neck Containers Only (#3 plastic resin);such as health & beauty aid products, household cleaners.

LDPE Grocery Containers (#4 plastic resin);such as margarine tubs, frozen desert cups, six and twelve pack rings.

PP Grocery Containers (#5 plastic resin);such as yogurt cups, and narrow neck syrup and ketchup bottles.

#7 Plastic Resin Narrow Neck Containers Only.

Plastic Buckets, such as kitty litter containers (5 gallon size maximum).

Glass Bottles and Jars (can take clear, brown, green only): no window glass, dinnerware or ceramics.

PS Polystyrene (#6 Plastic resin) is not recyclable at this time. Do not put #6 in recycle bin.

Commingled Paper Fiber:

Newspaper, including inserts (remove plastic sleeves)

Cardboard (no waxed cardboard)

Kraft (brown paper) **Bags**

Magazines, Catalogs and Telephone Books

Office & Computer Paper, Notebook & Gift Wrap Paper

(no metal clips, spirals, binders)

Chipboard (cereal, cake & food mix boxes, gift boxes, etc.)

Carrier Stock (soda & beer can carrying cases)

Mail, Junk Mail & Envelopes (no plastic cards, stick on labels or unused stamps)

Paper Back Books (no hard cover books)

Notes pertaining to commingle containers:

1. All containers to be emptied and rinsed clean.
2. No motor oil, insecticide, herbicide or hazardous chemical containers.
3. No plastic film (no plastic sheets, tarps or wrap).
4. No expanded foam or clear polystyrene per joint advisory from the Illinois Recycling Association, Illinois Department of Commerce & Community Affairs, and Region 5 US Environmental Protection Agency.

Note: Most programs in St. Louis County had limited recyclable programs. With Single Stream the green highlighted materials have been added to recycling programs.
