The City has been working with MSD to engineer storm water and street improvements on Park Avenue, which are anticipated to begin later this year. Community Development Block Grant Hearing

The City of Oakland will hold a public hearing to discuss the allocation of \$20,000 in Community Development Block Grant Funds which will become available after January 1, 2017. The Public Hearing will be held at 7:00 p.m. on June 6, 2016 at the Webster Groves Christian Church, 1320 Lockwood Blvd., Oakland MO 63122. Mosquito Season

The County will be monitoring mosquitoes each week this summer. If you would like to know if your area will be sprayed on a particular day, you can call the hotline at 615-4BUG around 5p.m.

Spraying is just one of many tools the County utilizes to control the types of mosquitoes which are active at night and most likely to carry disease. The best way to eliminate daytime mosquitoes, which are container breeders, is to eliminate sources of standing water around your home. Fountains, fish ponds, watering cans, flower pots, children's pools and any other containers which can hold water can lead to mosquitoes and should be kept empty and dry when not in use.
