Mosquito Season

This year, Oakland will be contracting with St. Louis County for both larvaciding and adulticiding (spraying) services. This means that the County will be setting traps in the area to monitor both the volume and the type of mosquitoes each week. They will also test mosquitoes for West Nile and other diseases. When spraying is needed to control the mosquito population, it will be done on Thursday evening. If you would like to know if your area will be sprayed on a particular day, you can call the hotline at 615-4BUG around 5p.m. Spraying is just one of many tools the County utilizes to

control the types of mosquitoes which are active at night and most likely to carry disease. Spraying is, however, fairly ineffective in controlling the day time mosquitoes most of us have come to hate as well. These mosquitoes are primarily "container breeders" meaning they breed in small amounts of water around the Their flying house. range is very small so if we see them, they are probably breeding In order to nearby. control mosquitoes around the house, clean rain gutters and downspouts, discard old tires, empty flower pots or buckets that hold water. store wheelbarrows and other equipment inside. empty/clean/refill birdbaths and wading pools weekly, stock ornamental ponds with fish that eat mosquito larvae, repair leaky outdoor faucets, secure swimming pool covers tightly, and keep grass and bushes trimmed. ID Cards

Individual ID cards for recreation facilities users will be issued at the Community Center during regular office hours. ID cards are \$4 each, both for originals and replacements and are good for up to three years. In order to obtain an ID card, each purchaser over age 15 must present a valid and current Missouri Driver's License showing resident address and a current utility (gas, water, electric or phone) bill, bank statement or voter ID card, issued to their home address within the last three months. Purchasers age 15 and under must be accompanied by a person at the same address who can present the documents listed.

Admission Policies

The Aquatic Center is only available to residents of Glendale, Kirkwood and Oakland. For entry into the pool, you will need to present a Kirkwood Parks and Recreation issued ID card. No other form of ID will be accepted to gain admittance into the facility. Each ID card holder will be allowed up to 4 guests per day, with a maximum allowance of 16 guests per family each day. All guests will pay non-resident daily admission fees. Check your ID card's expiration date-cards expiring in 2008 will need to be renewed this year.

Sewer Lateral Repair Program

The City of Oakland offers residents a Sewer Lateral Repair Program. If you think you have a collapsed pipe, contact a plumber and have the line cabled at your expense. Once you have received the tape, contact City Building Inspector Greg Hanser. He will review the tape to verify your eligibility. If eligible, the resident decides on a contractor to do the repair and then pays for the repair in full. Copies of the actual bill and receipt of payment can be sent to P. O. Box 220511, St. Louis, MO 63122 and reimbursement (up to \$2500) will be sent to you after approved at the next Board meeting.

Culvert Safety

City Officials and the Kirkwood Police Department want to remind all citizens, especially families with children and teenagers, that culverts are no place to play! Accidents in other areas have reminded us of the need to stay out of culverts at all times, not just when it is raining. Culverts along Gravois Creek are going to be marked with new "Danger-Do Not Enter" signs this spring and we ask that all residents heed this warning! If you notice anyone in the culverts near your home, don't hesitate to call Kirkwood Police to investigate.
