

**PUBLIC MEETING

CITY OF OAKLAND-BOARD OF ALDERMEN MEETING  
MINUTES**

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER by Mayor Stewart at 7PM.

ROLL CALL showed that all Board members were present.

APPROVAL OF THE FEBRUARY MINUTES Alderwoman Lueker moved, and Alderwoman Heaton Miller seconded, a motion to approve the February meeting minutes as submitted and the motion passed by a vote of 4-0.

REVIEW OF TREASURER’S REPORT AND APPROVAL OF EXPENSES The financial statements for the month were reviewed, noting that the payroll had been reviewed and approved by the Treasurer. The Board noted an additional check for Rios Landscape in the amount of \$2550 and with that addition the Board voted 4-0 in favor of approving the voucher.

CITY ENGINEER AND CODE ENFORCEMENT UPDATES, submitted in advance, were reviewed by the Board. The Board commended Mr. Hanser for his years of service and congratulated him on his retirement.

PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING ORDINANCE 904: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND, MISSOURI, REGARDING RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES IN THE CITY OF OAKLAND, MISSOURI SHARING A COMMON BORDER WITH THE CITY OF GLENDALE, MISSOURI Mayor Stewart opened the public hearing, and the City Attorney explained the need for the ordinance and the process by which the ordinance came to the Board upon referral from Planning and Zoning. The Board heard resident comments and comments from an impacted developer. The Board and residents asked clarifying questions. When there were no more questions or comments the mayor closed the public hearing.

ORDINANCE 904 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND, MISSOURI, REGARDING RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES IN THE CITY OF OAKLAND, MISSOURI SHARING A COMMON BORDER WITH THE CITY OF GLENDALE, MISSOURI Alderman Steuby moved, and Alderwoman Heaton Miller seconded, a motion for the first and second reading and subsequent passage of Ordinance 904. The City Attorney read the ordinance and a quorum was confirmed. After further discussion, Alderwoman Lueker moved, and Alderman Steuby seconded, a motion to add the word “impacted” as noted in Section D. The motion to amend passed by a vote of 4-0. The City Attorney read the ordinance a second time. A quorum was confirmed. Ordinance 904 then passed by a roll call vote of 4-0.

ORDINANCE 906 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE CITIES OF KIRKWOOD AND GLENDALE RELATING TO THE USE AND MAINTENANCE OF THE KIRKWOOD AQUATIC CENTER AND MATTERS RELATED THERETO Alderwoman Heaton Miller moved, and Alderwoman Lueker seconded, a motion for the first and second reading and subsequent passage of Ordinance 906. The City Attorney read the ordinance and a quorum was confirmed. The City Attorney read the ordinance a second time. A quorum was confirmed. Ordinance 906 then passed by a roll call vote of 4-0.

ORDINANCE 907 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND, MISSOURI, AMENDING CHAPTER 300 "THE TRAFFIC CODE" BY ADDING CERTAIN SECTIONS TO SECTION 300.005, SUBSECTION 12, BY ADDING VARIOUS STOPPING, SPEEDING, NO PARKING, NO ENTRY, YIELD, PEDESTRIAN CROSSING AND RAILROAD CROSSING REGULATIONS AND RELATED TRAFFIC SCHEDULES Alderman Morisse moved, and Alderwoman Lueker seconded, a motion for the first and second reading and subsequent passage of Ordinance 907. The City Attorney read the ordinance and a quorum was confirmed. The City Attorney read the ordinance a second time. A quorum was confirmed. Ordinance 907 then passed by a roll call vote of 4-0. The Board authorized the City Attorney to revise the formatting of the related schedules for ease of codification.

CITIZEN COMMENTS The Board heard questions and comments regarding the regulation of traffic in the City and potential infill housing and the applicable regulations related to water runoff.

#### SPECIAL DISCUSSION

- 1) The allocation of CDBG funds and potential pedestrian improvements to the Oakland bridge were discussed.
- 2) The potential use of ARPA funds for public improvements had been discussed.
- 3) The status of Big Bend traffic issues was discussed.
- 4) The Board noted a request for a temporary Storybook Walk along the bike trail in the City and had no objections.
- 5) The City Administrator had nothing further.

Alderwoman Lueker had nothing further.

Alderwoman Heaton Miller had nothing further.

Alderman Morisse had nothing further.

Alderman Steuby had nothing further.

Mayor Stewart had nothing further.

The meeting was adjourned by a vote of 4-0.
